EAEP is an academic cooperation in M.Th and D.Min degree programs in Christianity and theologies of indigenous people in Asia involving Yushan Theological Seminary (Taiwan), Myanmar Institute of Theology (Myanmar), Sabah Theological Seminary (Malaysia) and Union Theological Seminary (Philippines).

ATESEA Board of Trustees Meeting



Members of the Board of Trustees of ATESEA met at Chiang Mai, Thailand on December 2-3, 2016. At the meeting plans were finalized for the ATESEA Assembly (that meets once in four years) from March 21 to 23, 2017 at Central Philippines University, IloIlo City, Philippines. The Board of Trustees has also decided to reorganize the ATESEA Theological Union (ATU) and bring the proposal to the Assembly for a renewed ATU as a facilitator for strengthening and coordinating graduate level theological education programs and research in Southeast Asia.
